# The following checklist was provided by our Guidance Office to guide you through the College Admissions Process.

## **Before Junior Year**

- ✓ <u>Create a College Board Account</u>. Use your personal email. Store username and password in a safe place. <u>Make a plan</u> to help you keep track of your College Admissions Process.
- ✓ Begin exploring potential colleges. Use <u>College Board</u> or <u>College Scorecard</u> to create a list of 5-10 schools.
- ✓ <u>Extracurricular</u> activities. Summer is a great time to being volunteering. Not sure what to do? Find ideas here.
- ✓ Take the offered "College and Career" course at HIS or "Preparing for College Admission" at NSA.
- ✓ Consider taking 1-2 AP Courses or Honors Courses through North Star Academy.

## **Junior Year**

## **August**

• Begin thinking about <u>careers and college majors</u>.

#### October

• Take the PSAT (offered at HIS for 9th-11th grade). Practice here: <u>PSAT</u>.

#### November

• Schedule to take the <u>SAT</u> or <u>ACT</u>. The best time to take the test is March of your Junior year or around the same time that you finish Algebra 2. Which test should I take? Find more info here: <u>ACT and SAT.</u>

#### January

 PSAT Scores are released! <u>Link your KHAN Academy account and College Board Accounts</u> and begin practicing for the SAT.

## April

• Learn about the <u>College Application Process</u>. Figure out which teacher you will ask for a <u>letter of recommendation</u> and complete this <u>form</u> to assist them in writing an excellent letter.

#### May

• Use <u>College Board</u> to narrow your list to 3-5 colleges. <u>Choosing a University.</u>

## **Before Senior Year**

- ✓ Participate in extracurricular activities.
- ✓ Register for the SAT or ACT (most universities want test scores by December 1<sup>st</sup> of your Senior Year)
- ✓ Make sure that you understand the components needed for the College Application Process.
- ✓ Make a schedule to <u>tour schools</u>. Take a <u>virtual tour</u>.

## **Senior Year**

## **August**

- Visit your prospective 3-5 universities' websites. Research deadlines for applications and scholarships and mark these dates on your calendar.
- Determine if you qualify for scholarships based your current SAT/ACT scores. Decide if you need to take SAT/ACT again. Research other <u>Scholarships and Financial Aid Information</u> and check out these <u>potential scholarships</u>.

## September

## **The College Application Process**

- Common App is great at <u>organizing your application</u> dates.
- Find out if your university of interest uses <u>Common App</u> or <u>another program</u>. If you are using Common App, make sure to add your <u>Guidance Counselor's information</u> to your Common App.
- Work on Applications. Here you will find the <u>Ranking information</u> you will need.
- o <u>Essay:</u> Review prompts, choose one or two and brainstorm ideas, write rough draft.
- View tips for <u>Letters of recommendation</u>
- o Request transcripts to send to prospective colleges.

#### October

- Proofread and finalize your <u>essay</u> for the application.
- Verify that you have at least 1 letter of recommendation. Send your letter writer a thank you card.

#### **November**

- Begin Financial Aid
  - Gather Documents
  - o FAFSA
  - Scholarship and Financial Aid Information
  - o Potential Scholarships

#### **December**

- Many scholarship/application deadlines are December 1<sup>st</sup>. **Be sure to check your deadlines!**
- If you are taking AP classes, decide if you will take the AP exam.

## January/February

• Send Mid-Year Reports to Universities

## April

- Review Acceptance Letters and send a copy to: <a href="mailto:jiorgensen@highlandsinternational.org">jiorgensen@highlandsinternational.org</a>
- Compare Schools
- Make your final decision and pay the deposit.

## May

• Notify schools you have chosen not to attend that you have chosen a different university.

#### June

Request a <u>transcript</u> for the college that you will attend in the Fall.

## July

• Rest and Relax before college starts!
